Page 46, Callouts:


Change the callout on the left side of Step 11's illustration to be 1/2" rather than 1/4". The 1/4" seam allowance at the bottom of the illustration is correct.


Page 55, Step 7:

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A note from Rita:

"It really doesn't matter where you make the cut in this pattern, the important thing to remember is once you make the first cut to open up the tube, make all of the other ones the same as the first one. If you look at the relationship of the dots to the squares you will notice that the dot moves over one square and down three. Also remember to mark your dots along the raw edges on the seam allowance. If you follow that formula and start all of your cuts in exactly the same place and have your tubes all turned the correct way you should be able to make this pattern in any combination of colors. To make it in any number of colors make sure the amount of continuous strips in your tube are a multiple of the amount of colors you are using If you are using four colors or less double the amount of strips. You can also play around with the tubes in steps 12 and 13 rotating and matching them up in different ways to come up with some other interesting patterns. This is a fun pattern and can easily have unlimited variations."
