Corrections below apply to various early printings.

Square-in-a-Square Quilt

Page 14, This quilt measures 52 1/2" x 58 1/2"

Page 15, Fabric Requirements

Backing should be 3 1/3 yards.

Batting should be 56" x 62".

Binding should be 1/2 yard.

Page 18, See attached page for corrected Square-in-a-Square pattern.

Pineapple Quilt

Page 20, Step 5 should be: Turn the paper pattern over and stitch on the line between the center and triangle 1.

Page 25, See attached page for corrected Flying Geese Border pattern.

Kaleidoscope Quilt

Page 32, See attached page for corrected Kaleidoscope Block patterns.

New York Beauty Quilt

Page 37

Step 10 should be: Continue pinning the curve, aligning the raw edges. Pin very closely as shown below.

Step 11 should be: Stitch using 1/4" seam allowance with B on top. To ensure accuracy, stitch with the paper side up so you can clearly see the guidelines. Press toward B.

Basket Quilt

Page 42

Fabric Requirements: Outer border should be 1 1/2 yards.


Step 2 should be: Cut an irregular three-, four-, or five-sided patch about 2" in size.


Page 44, Outer Border, Step 2 should be: Trim to create 2 strips 6" x 49 1/2".




Sampler Quilt

Page 45, The caption should be: the quilt contains six 6" Square-in-a-Square, four 4"
Kaleidoscope, four 6" Basket, four 8" New York Beauty, and two 8" Pineapple blocks.
Page 46, first column, corrected sizes of the blocks you need to make: four 4" (finished)
Kaleidoscope blocks, four 8" (finished) New York Beauty blocks, and two 8" (finished)
Pineapple blocks.












- **7.** Refer to the illustration for the correct placement as you attach a border corner section to the right end of the bottom border section.
- **8.** Attach the border from Step 7 to the bottom edge of the quilt. Press.
- **9.** Remove the paper if you haven't already.

Congratulations, your Kaleidoscope quilt is completed! Now it's time to layer, baste, quilt, and bind with guidance from General Instructions (pages 8–13).



Use a ruler to measure these inch marks to verify that printout is correctly sized.





8. Stitch the basket handle/background triangle to the crazy-patch unit. Press toward the handle section. Join the small triangle and the square, lining up the straight edges on both sides.



9. Sew the triangle/square units to the base. Sew on the bottom triangle and press toward the bottom triangle. Remove the paper.





QUILT TOP CONSTRUCTION

Press following the arrows.

- **1.** Arrange your blocks in a straight set, as shown.
- **2.** Sew the blocks in rows. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.

Inner Border

- **1.** Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $36\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew onto the sides. Press toward the inner border.
- **2.** Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $38\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew onto the top and bottom. Press toward the inner border.

Outer Border

- **1.** Cut two $6'' \times 38\frac{1}{2}''$ strips. Sew onto the sides. Press toward the outer border.
- **2.** Cut three strips $6'' \times$ width of fabric. Piece end to end and trim to create two $6'' \times 49\frac{1}{2}''$ strips. Sew onto the top and bottom. Press toward the outer border.

Congratulations, your quilt top is completed! Now it's time to layer, baste, quilt, and bind, following General Instructions (pages 8–13).
