The students taking this class will enjoy shopping in your shop for the materials needed for this project. Students will need to pick out four cotton prints. Picking fabrics is the best part, isn't it? The sewing machine cover will get them into your trimmings and interfacing sections too.

Required text: At Home with Modern June by Kelly McCants

- 2 coordinating ½ yard cuts of cotton fabric.
- 2 contrasting fat quarters of cotton fabric
- 1 ½ yards of Shape-Flex by C&T Publishing a lightweight fusible interfacing.
- 1 packages of 1/2" double fold bias or 2 yards
- 2 yards of 1/2" grossgrain ribbon
