Class Description

In this hands-on class the students in the class will be able to make blocks from one of three quilt patterns. Incline, Math Class & Stacked Up are all made from the same foundation block. This gives the students more options.

- Students must have a basic knowledge of sewing and cutting fabric.
- In this class students will make at least one block, then learn to chain piece to make the guilt very guickly.
- This class and quilts are a fun twist on a traditional log cabin quilt block. Students will leave feeling excited about modern log cabin quilt blocks.

Class Length

In one three hour class students should be able to make at least one block and then chain piece several steps in the remainder of the blocks.

Class Supply List

- Cabin Fever: 20 Modern Log Cabin Quilts book.
- Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine, rotary mat ruler and cutter, thread, scissors extra needles.


Baby: 36"x36"- 5/8 yard assorted prints, 1 3/8 yards white fabric Throw: 60"x72" – 1 2/3 yard assorted prints, 3 1/2 yards white fabric Coverlet: 96"x96" – 3 3/8 yards assorted prints, 6 3/4 yards white fabric

Math Class:

Baby: 36"x36" - 1 yard assorted prints, 1 1/8 yard white fabric Throw: 60"x72" - 2 1/4 yards assorted prints, 2 7/8 yards white fabric Coverlet: 96"x96" - 4 1/2 yards assorted prints, 6 yards white fabric

Stacked Up:

Baby: 34"x34" – 3/4 yard orange fabric, 1/2 yard sand fabric, 1 1/2 yards



white fabric

Throw: 68"x68" – 1 1/8 yards orange fabric, 1 1/8 yards green fabric, 1 yard sand fabric, 3 1/4 yards white fabric.

Coverlet: 102"x102" – 1 1/2 yards orange fabric, 1 1/2 yards green fabric, 1 1/2 yards pink fabric, 1 7/8 yards sand fabric, 6 7/8 yards sand fabric.

TIP: These three quilts can all be made from Jelly Rolls, each one will need up to three jelly rolls. It's a great way to make the cutting process move quickly.

Classroom Preparation

Each classroom will need ironing boards, irons and basic sewing supplies.

Class Agenda

Before the class have each student cut fabrics for desired quilt, all three quilts can be made in Baby 36"x36", Throw 60"x72" or Coverlet 96"x96".

Follow the step by step instructions, have each student make one single block. After one block is complete have the students chain piece their blocks.
