Pages 71-73 Illustrations have been corrected to show the seam allowances.

Rock Star

Pages 79, 81 Yardage, cutting, and illustration corrected for squares instead of rectangles at the ends of rows 3, 4, 6, 7, 9, 10, 12, 13, 15, and 16.

If you have already cut your fabric (with rectangles), note these corrections:

Page 81, Step 3, it is easier to sew the units into horizontal rows. For rows 3 and 4, sew the squares into rows, then sew the 2 rows together, and then sew the rectangles onto each end. Repeat for rows 6/7, 9/10, 12/13, and 15/16.

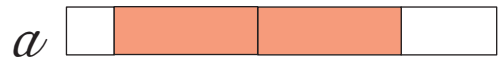

Scrap-Happy

Page 53, The instructions for the corner blocks have been added.

2. Gather 2 body rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ in Print 4, 1 white square $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$, and 1 white rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Arrange the pieces into 1 row as shown and sew together. Press. **Fig. A**

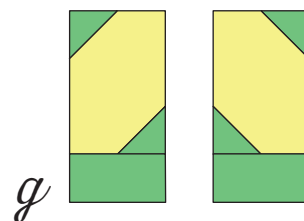
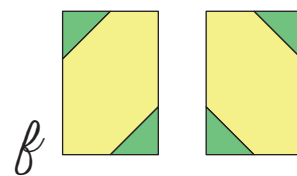
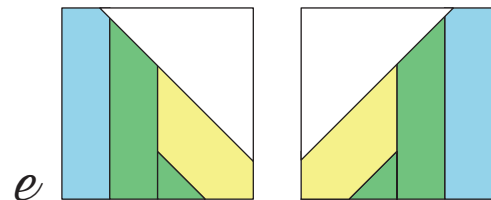
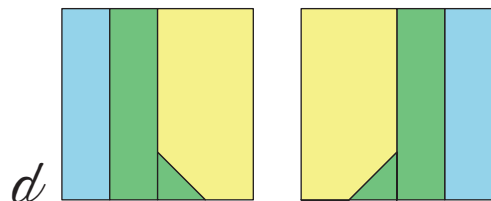
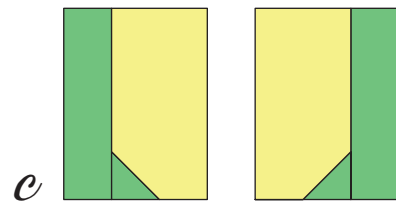
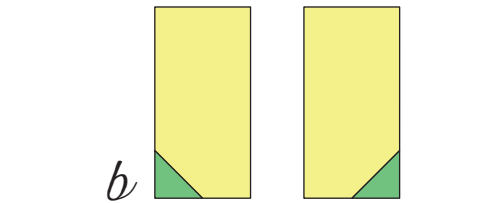

Easy Corner Triangles

In the following steps, you will mark designated squares and place them right sides together according to the diagrams. Pay attention to the orientation of the marked lines, as they are mirrored within each set. Once everything is placed correctly, stitch along the marked lines, trim to a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance, and press.

3. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 2. Sew 1 marked square to each rectangle $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 3, as shown. **Fig. B**
4. Sew 1 rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 2 to the outside of each unit from Step 3. Press. **Fig. C**
5. Sew 1 rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 1 to the outside of each unit from Step 4. Press. **Fig. D**
6. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 white squares $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew 1 marked white square to each unit from Step 5 as shown. Press. **Fig. E**
7. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 4 squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 2. Sew 2 marked squares to 1 rectangle $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 3, as shown. Press. **Fig. F**
8. Sew 1 rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 2 to bottom of each unit from Step 7, as shown. Press. **Fig. G**



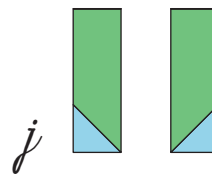
9. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 white squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew 1 marked white square to each $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangle of Print 1. Press. **Fig. H**



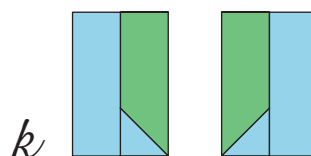
10. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 2. Sew 1 marked square to each unit from Step 9, as shown. Press. **Fig. I**



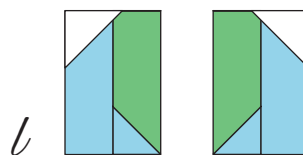
11. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 1. Sew to each $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangle of Print 2. Press. **Fig. J**



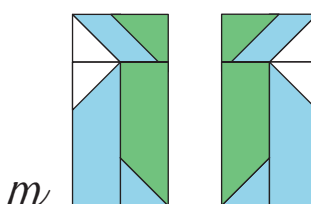
12. Sew 1 rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 1 to each unit from Step 11, as shown. Press. **Fig. K**



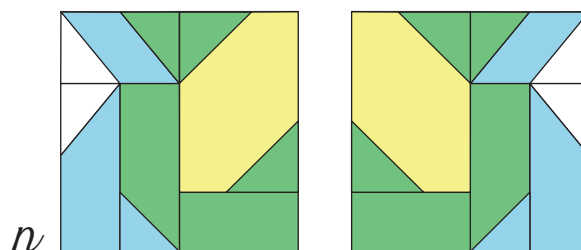
13. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 white squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew 1 marked white square to each unit from Step 12, as shown. Press. **Fig. L**



14. Sew 1 unit from Step 10 to the top of each unit from Step 13, as shown. Press. **Fig. M**



15. Sew 1 unit from Step 14 to each unit from Step 8, as shown. Press. **Fig. N**



16. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 white squares $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew 1 marked white square to each remaining rectangle $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 1. Press. **Fig. O**

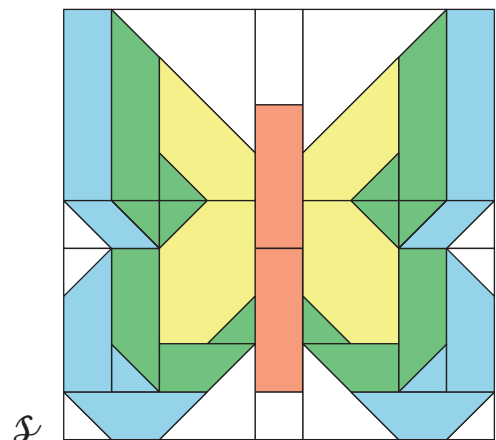
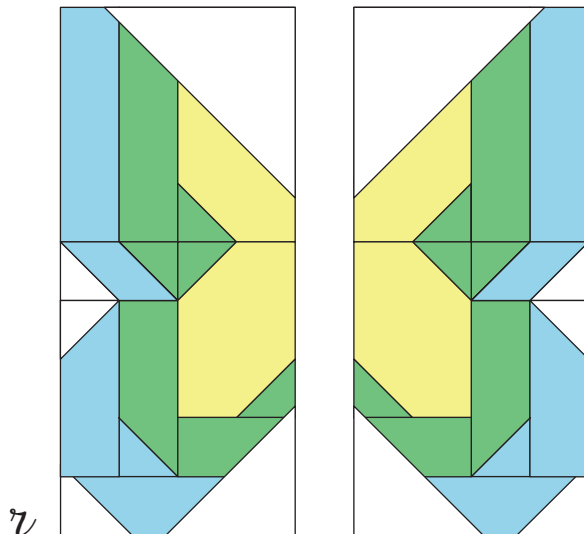
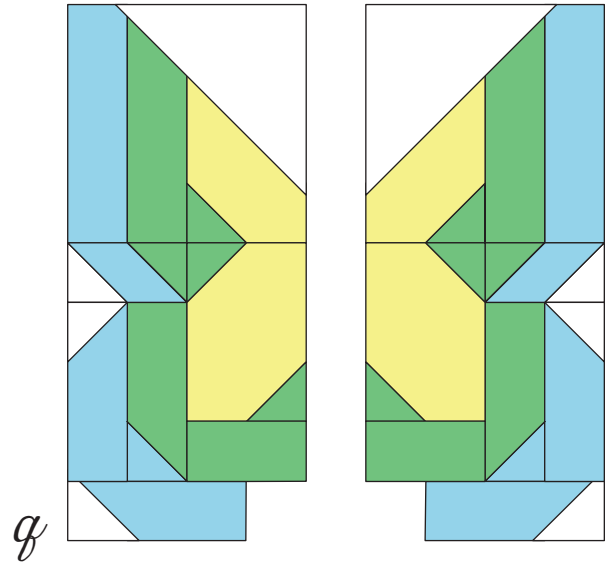
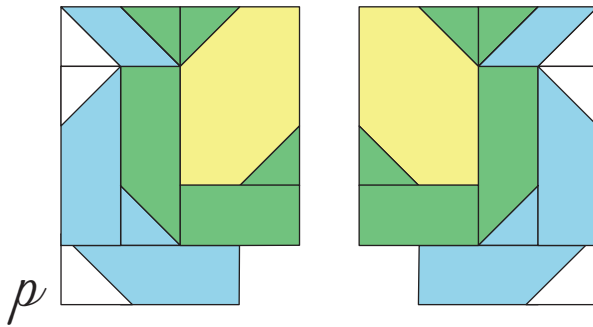


17. Sew each unit from Step 16 to each unit from Step 15, as shown. Press. **Fig. P**

18. Sew each unit from Step 17 to each unit from Step 6, as shown. Press. **Fig. Q**

19. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 2 white squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew 1 marked white square to each unit from Step 18, as shown. Press. **Fig. R**

20. Sew the units from Step 19 and Step 2 together, as shown. Make 12 blocks. **Fig. S**

materials

3 charm packs or 10 fat quarters
or scraps
3 yards of cream fabric
1¼ yards of border fabric

5 yards of backing fabric
¾ yard of binding fabric
77" × 89" batting

cutting

For the blocks

3 charm packs

- Organize the charm squares by print (there will be multiples of 3). Select 38 matching pairs and set them aside. Select 38 squares 5" × 5" (for the star centers) and trim each to 4½" × 4½".

10 fat quarters

From each fat quarter:

- Cut 2 strips 5" × 22" and subcut into 8 squares 5" × 5". Organize the 5" × 5" squares into 38 matching pairs. There will be extra. Cut 1 strip 4½" × 22" and subcut each into 4 squares 4½" × 4½" until you have 38.

Scraps

- Cut or gather 38 matching pairs of 5" × 5" squares and 38 squares 4½" × 4½".

Cream fabric

- Cut 10 strips 5" × WOF. Subcut into 5" × 5" squares, 8 per strip, until you have 76.
- Cut 4 strips 4½" × WOF. Subcut into 1 rectangle 4½" × 20½" per strip, until you have 4. From the excess, cut 4 rectangles 4½" × 8½".
- Cut 7 strips 4½" × WOF. Subcut into 4½" × 4½" squares, 8 per strip, until you have 52.

CUTTING IT UP



This quilt uses 114 squares 5" × 5". Whether the 5" × 5" squares come from charm packs, fat quarters, or scraps, sort them into 38 sets of 2, with each set containing 2 of the same print. Set aside another 38 squares 5" × 5" for the star centers.

Border fabric

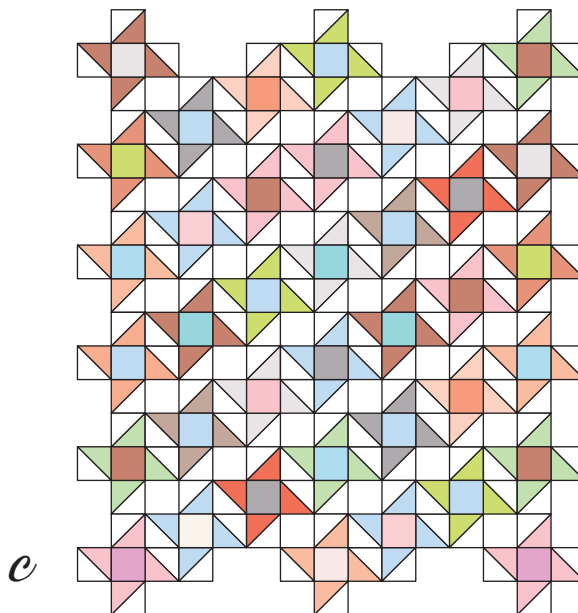
- Cut 8 strips 5" × WOF. Piece together in pairs along the short sides to make 4 border strips.

Binding fabric

- Cut 9 strips 2½" × WOF.

PUT IT TOGETHER

1. Arrange the Friendship Star sets into columns, beginning on the left side and moving to the right, staggering the columns as shown. **Fig. C**
2. Add the cream squares and rectangles where there are spaces.
3. Sew the units into rows and press.
4. Sew together the rows and press.

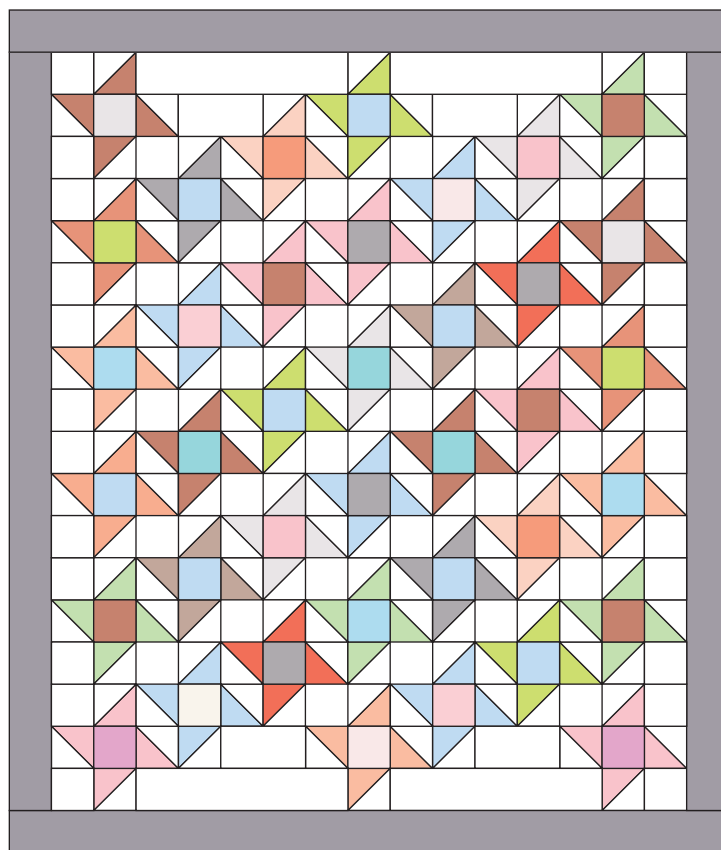


BORDER

1. Measure the length of the quilt in several places to determine the average. Trim 2 pieced border strips to match your measurement and sew to the right and left sides of the quilt. Press.
2. Repeat this process for the top and bottom borders.

FINISH

Baste, quilt, and bind using your preferred method, or refer to *Finishing the Quilt* (page 124).

construction

Seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise noted. Press open the seam allowances unless otherwise directed. Sew fabrics with right sides together.

MAKE THE BLOCKS

To make 1 block, gather the following:

2 squares $5'' \times 5''$ of Print 1

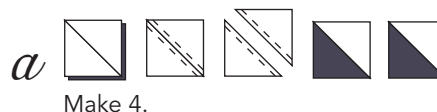
4 squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ of Print 1

2 white squares $5'' \times 5''$

4 white squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$

Half-Square Triangles

1. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 1 white square $5'' \times 5''$. Place right sides together with 1 square $5'' \times 5''$ of Print 1. Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ away from the marked line on both sides. Cut along the marked line, and press toward the dark print. Square-up each Half-Square Triangle to $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$. Make 4. **Fig. A**

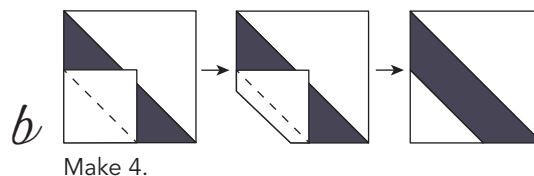


TIP

Handy Help

The $4\frac{1}{2}''$ Bloc Loc ruler makes it easy to trim perfect Half-Square Triangle blocks.

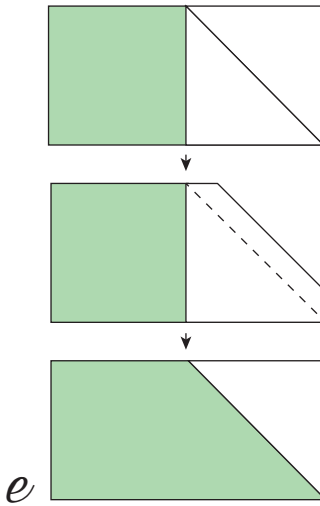
2. Mark a diagonal line on the back of 4 white squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Place one of them atop a Half-Square Triangle, aligning the marked square in the corner of Print 1, as shown. Sew along the marked line, trim to a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam, and press. Make 4. **Fig. B**



Flying Geese

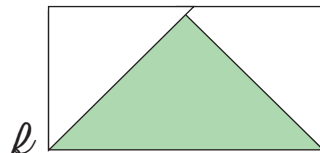
1. Gather 1 sashing rectangle $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ and 2 cream squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

2. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each cream square $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Align 1 marked cream square along the short edge of 1 sashing rectangle $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$, as shown. Sew along the marked line, trim to a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance, and press open the seam. **Fig. E**

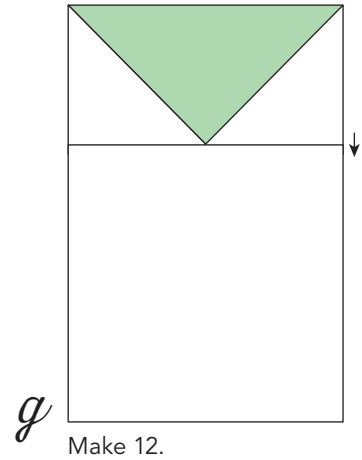
3. Place another cream square on the other side of a unit from Step 2, orienting the marked line as shown. Sew along the marked line, trim to a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance, and press open the seam. Make 16. **Fig. F**

4. Sew together 1 cream square $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ and 1 unit from Step 3, as shown. Press. Make 12. **Fig. G**

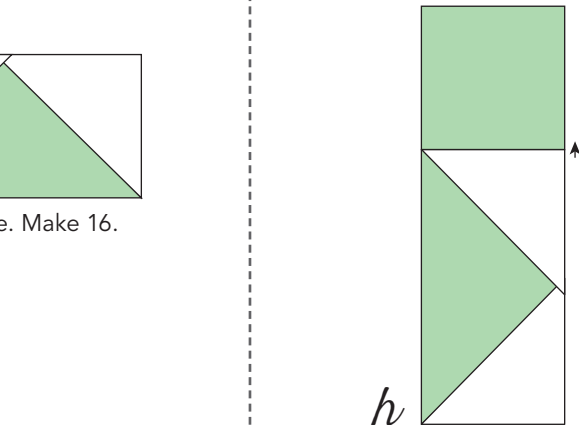

5. Gather the 4 remaining units from Step 3 and the 4 sashing squares $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

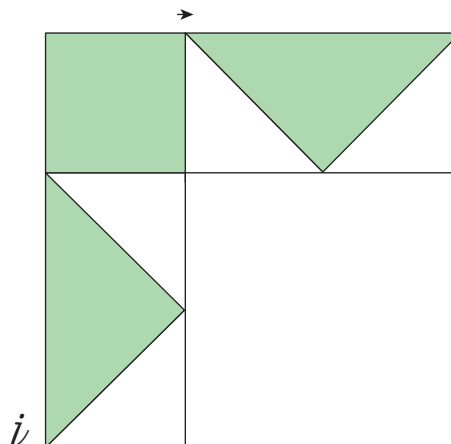
6. Sew together 1 sashing square to 1 unit from Step 3, as shown. Press. Make 4. **Fig. H**
