Body

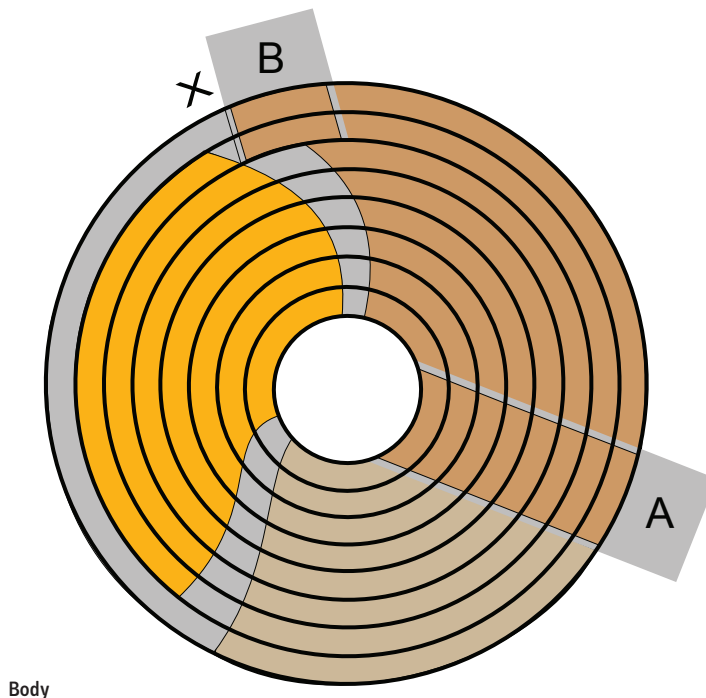
1st–6th Layers: Insert Rectangle A for the tail between the two cardboard disks so that it is wedged between them. Wrap beige yarn around it twice. Follow the winding pattern around the disk for the rest of the layer. In each layer, wrap the light gray yarn around the cardboard disks once, and make sure that the other colors aren't overlapping the gray threads within the inner circle. This will later ensure a continuous gray pattern around the red breast patch.

7th Layer: Place Rectangle B for the wings sideways so that it is wedged inside. Wrap three times with beige. Wrap Rectangle A twice with beige. Then continue to work around the disk as before. Do not allow the thread of A and B to overlap within the inner space.

8th Layer: Work your way around the disk as shown in the winding pattern. Do not allow the threads of A and B to overlap within the inner circle. Finish up by wrapping A twice and B three times.

Finishing Up

Finish the two pom-poms (body and head), trim them into shape, and connect them together with the binding threads. You can find the exact steps for this in Techniques (page 6), which will also show you how to shape the tail and wing tips. Finally, glue the eyes, beak, and feet onto the pom-pom bird.





Body B

1st–8th Layers: Insert Rectangle A between the cardboard disks so that the edge is wedged between them. Wrap three times each with black in the 1st and 2nd layer, then twice each with the graphite/gray (1:1). Moving clockwise, wrap the cardboard disks with gold, grasshopper green, graphite/gray (1:1), and oasis green. For the narrow strip in graphite/gray (1:1), wrap the yarn twice around the cardboard disks twice in each layer. To finish, make sure that the threads of the strip and the tail touch inside the disks, so that there is a continuous line later.

Finishing Up

- 1 Finish the three pom-poms. You can find the exact steps for this in Techniques (page 6). The woodpecker has a slightly longer body, so it is made from two pom-poms. First, connect body A and body B firmly with the binding threads to form an oval. The stripes meet on both sides. Trim the oval into shape.
- 2 Shape the head with scissors next. Then join the head and the body together with the binding threads. Shape the tail and wing tips.
- 3 Glue the eyes, beak, and feet onto the pom-pom bird. Reference the photo to determine positioning. Finally, wrap the base of the legs with some yarn in grasshopper green and glue the beginning and end of the thread into the pom-pom.
